Dear Dr. Anderson,

I send a reply to yours of June 28 to your New Haven address about middle of last month²; & am now sending under separate cover (by 2nd-class air-mail, registered), to the same address, & carbon copy of my John Lockes. You'll find the system Q described in lectures IV & V.

About mail to me: My forwarding address at Oxford will be c/o Prof. Gilbert Ryle, Magdalen College, Oxford, England. Between Dec. 22, 1955 & about the end of January 1956 I will on shipboard & inaccessible to mail; & I should say that surface mail from the beginning of October, & air mail from the beginning of December, would be more sure to reach me if sent to Oxford; before then, to me here at Canterbury College.

I have inferred from your letter that you have moved permanently to New Haven, but in case that is not so, will send a note to Dartmouth saying that I have sent this letter & the lectures.
