Dear Hans<sup>1</sup>,

Dana Scott tells me that you are just finishing a thesis on tense-logic. My new book Past, Present & Future ought to be appearing in 2 or 3 months, & the Clarendon Press have also consented to publish, next year, a collection of my papers on this subject. In this letter, I intend to include a "Bibliography of Tense-Logic". In this, I'm only including things that are on tense logic properly so-called – not, e.g., general philosophical reflections on this subject of Time; & not items that are just on ordinary modal logic. This makes the bibliography fairly short, but I am inclined to include in it such Ph.D. theses as I know of, e.g. Nino's. Can I include yours? If so, what is its title?
